



## Sample Bequest Language for the *St. John XXIII Parish*

*“As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God’s varied grace”  
(1 Peter 4:10)*

Bequests and other testamentary gifts by the faithful are a significant source of financial support for the church and its ministries. As you discern the best plan for the allocation of your estate beyond your lifetime, you may identify the ability to continue your charitable gifts. This document is designed to be a resource for you as you meet with your advisors.

You can make a specific gift of cash, securities, real estate or other property through your will, codicil or trust instrument. You can also name *St. John XXIII Parish* as the beneficiary of all or part of your estate or trust. This can be the remainder after the payment of estate-related expenses, other bequests, or following the death of a spouse or other primary beneficiaries. Examples of this language are below:

### **SAMPLE TESTAMENTARY LANGUAGE:**

You may make a **specific gift** as follows:

I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to *St. John XXIII Parish*,

the sum of \$\_\_\_\_\_ **or** \_\_\_\_\_% of my estate, **or**

the property described as \_\_\_\_\_

It is my desire and instruction this bequest to *St. John XXIII Parish, 1710 Melrose Place, Knoxville, TN 37916* to be used for its unrestricted use (or identify a specific purpose). In the event that at some future time due to changed circumstances, in the judgment of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Knoxville, it becomes impractical to apply my bequest to the designated purpose(s), the Roman Catholic Diocese of Knoxville shall make such modifications as will appropriately recognize my interests in cooperation with *St. John XXIII Parish’s* pastor.

**or**

You may make a **residual gift** of assets remaining after all other specific bequests have been satisfied as follows:

I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to *St. John XXIII Parish*,

the rest, remainder, and residue of my estate, **or**

\_\_\_\_% of the rest, remainder, and residue of my estate.

It is my desire and instruction this bequest to *St. John XXIII Parish, 1710 Melrose Place, Knoxville, TN 37916*, to be used for its unrestricted use (or identify a specific purpose). In the event that at some future time due to changed circumstances, in the judgment of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Knoxville, it becomes impractical to apply my bequest to the designated purpose(s), the Roman Catholic Diocese of Knoxville shall make such modifications as will appropriately recognize my interests in cooperation with *St. John XXIII Parish's* pastor.

**or**

You may make a **contingent gift** to take effect only if those names as primary beneficiaries predecease you as follows:

Should any or all of the above named beneficiaries do not survive me, then I hereby give the share that otherwise would be (*his/hers/theirs*) to *St. John XXIII Parish, 1710 Melrose Place, Knoxville, TN 37916*.

It is my desire and instruction this bequest to the Roman Catholic Diocese of Knoxville be designated to *St. John XXIII Parish* to be used for its unrestricted use (or identify a specific purpose). In the event that at some future time due to changed circumstances, in the judgment of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Knoxville, it becomes impractical to apply my bequest to the designated purpose(s), the Roman Catholic Diocese of Knoxville shall make such modifications as will appropriately recognize my interests in cooperation with *St. John XXIII Parish's* pastor.

Another way is to give is to designate *St. John XXIII Parish* as a beneficiary or contingent beneficiary of your **retirement plan or life insurance policy**. Simply enter *St. John XXIII Parish Federal Tax ID# 62-0630114* on the **Change of Beneficiary Form**, available from your plan administrator.
